

On Thursday 18 September 2008, to mark the next Nuit des Bains in Geneva, BFAS Blondeau Fine Art Services is delighted to present, in its space at 5 rue de la Muse, the works of 31 international artists under the title *Political Corect*.

The art of politically correct or politically correct in art?

The starting point of this exhibition is a work by Martin Kippenberger executed in 1994, on which appears in bright red the slogan "Political Corect". The euphemistic idea that implies this expression – which acquired its well-known acceptation in the USA in the eighties – gives the work the status of "comment-painting".... While not defining itself as committed, it initiated a discussion on censorship and violation of freedom of expression, questioning the form that may – or may not - take the political correctness in art. Around Kippenberger's canvas the works of artists, mostly American, will be displayed: Chris Burden, Sarah Charlesworth, Larry Clark, Michael Cline, Jason Fox, Group Material, Daniel Hesidence, Mike Kelley, Richard Kern, Edward Kienholz, Louise Lawler, Justin Lieberman, Robert Longo, Robert Mapplethorpe, Raymond Pettibon, Jerry Phillips, Charles Ray, Matthew Ronay, Kay Rosen, Martha Rosler, Peter Saul, Stephen Shames, Jim Shaw and Ivan Witenstein, but also Adel Abdessemed, Maurizio Cattelan, General Idea, Erik van Lieshout, Dominic McGill, Jean-Luc Verna, and Johannes Wohnseifer.

A text by Hudson, from Feature Inc., New York will accompany the exhibition.
